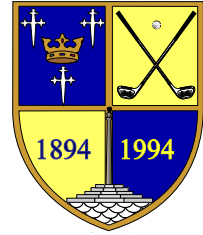

Club & Course Regulations

Visitors are kindly requested to observe the following dress code:-

The committee at Bedale Golf Club has agreed an enlightened attitude to the dress code requirements on the Course and in the Clubhouse. It is the responsibility of members and visitors to present themselves with attire and footwear, which is smart, clean and tidy and appropriate for the circumstances.

Our aim is to provide a relaxing, casual atmosphere for both members and visitors on the course and in the Clubhouse.

Inevitably there will be occasions when even a relaxed code will be abused and would therefore highlight that which is or is not broadly acceptable.

1. The overall standard we expect would be clothing that is accepted as traditional golfing apparel.
2. Shirts to be collared but collarless shirts marketed, as golf wear would be acceptable. Shirts for men, must be sleeved, ladies may be without sleeves.
3. Shorts must be tailored and worn with predominantly white or coloured ankle socks matching the colour of the shorts. Knee length socks may be any colour.
4. Denim jeans may be worn in the Clubhouse but NOT on the course. They must be clean and without "raggy holes".
5. Trainers will be allowed in the Clubhouse but NOT on the course. Shoes worn on the course must not be worn in the Clubhouse/lounge areas. For your safety and enjoyment we would strongly advise that any shoes worn on the course should be spiked at all times. Junior tigers may wear trainers at the discretion of the junior co-ordinator.
6. Vests, tee shirts, rugby and football shirts, tracksuits, shell suits and loose fitting shorts MAY NOT be worn at any time.
7. Hats must not be worn in the Clubhouse.

Mobile Phones: Are not permitted in the lounge/dining room.

Handicaps: All visitors will be expected to be current members of a golf club with an official handicap.

Competitions: TWO BALL MATCHES, FOUR BALL MEDALS AND TEXAS SCRAMBLES ARE **NOT PERMITTED.**

Numbers: On Wednesday, Ladies Day, numbers are not to exceed 32 and visitors are restricted to a maximum of 27 holes.

Catering: We are unable to book the dining room exclusively for your use. On rare occasions we may need to accommodate another match/party at the same time as, or very soon after, your group. On such occasions you may be asked to take your evening meal coffee (if booked) in the lounge. We appreciate your co-operation in this regard.

Play: Play to commence from the 1st tee only. This will be reserved for your exclusive use at the times agreed on the reservation notice. Please ensure that your members do not start early but do go off promptly. Matches to go off at 8-minute intervals. Only wide wheeled trolleys or carry bags are permitted.

Play must be from the *Yellow Markers Only.*
